COLLABORATIVE FUNDING AGREEMENT**

In order to support intensive early intervention programs for young children who have autism or related disorders, the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS), Department of Special Education/Early Intervention Services, has developed a program to provide limited reimbursement to families who have developed supplemental in-home Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) programs for their children. The early intervention pilot program is offered to children through their kindergarten year.

The reimbursement for supplemental in-home ABA instruction is offered to enhance and accelerate learning through collaboration between providers of the in-home ABA program and HCPSS staff providing services to fully implement your child's IFSP/IEP. Its purpose is to intensify your child's educational program within the Howard County Public School System and to minimize the potential need for more restrictive services.

In order to be considered for limited reimbursement the following criteria must be met:

- The child is fully participating in HCPSS services to implement the IFSP/IEP
- The in-home ABA program is targeting IFSP/IEP goals
- The in-home ABA program consultant meets appropriate criteria
